*** LOCATION OF THE COLLEGE:**

The college is exactly situated at Satsia village, 1/2 KM. distance from Poravita Bazar. About 10 KM. East from Fakirganj Police Station, the college is about 12 KM distance in the North West Pole from Tikrikilla Bazar (Meghalaya), about 25 KM distance in the West-North Pole from Lakhipur Town.

Four-Year under Graduate Degree Programme (FYUGP)

(For details see the Gauhati University website (<https://gauhati.ac.in>))

The Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) based on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy recognizes that higher education plays an extremely important role in promoting human as well as social well-being. The policy also endeavors developing India as envisioned in its Constitution- a democratic, just, socially conscious, cultured and humane nation upholding liberty, equality, fraternity and justice for all, NEP 2020 notes that "given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals".

The FYUGP is designed to cater to the diverse academic needs of the student and seeks to offer options of multiple entries/exits and obtain a Certificate or a Diploma or Degree with or without Major or a Degree (Honours) with Research at various levels as stipulated under the policy.

Objectives

The aims and objectives of the FYUGP under NEP 2020 are to highlight certain fundamental principles that would guide both the education system at large, as well as individual educational institutions. These objectives have a direct bearing on the curricula for different levels of higher education.

Programme and curricular components

Overview and structure

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semesters, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a maximum credit allocation of 22. The credit requirements for GU'S FYUGP is as follows

- (a) Semester I:22
- (b) Semester II:22
- (c) Semester III: 22
- (d) Semester IV 22
- (e) Semester V:22
- (f) Semester VI:22
- (g) Semester VII: 22
- (h) Semester VIII 22
- (i) Total: 176

Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP)

Course-wise credit requirements

Below, we provide the minimum credit requirement for various course along with a mention of their semesters (as prescribed by the UGC).

(I) Core Course

- a) First Major: 60 (Semesters 1-6)
- b) Minor: 12 (Semesters 1-6)
- c) Second Major (Double Major): 48 (Semesters 1-6)

(II) Common Course

- a) Multidisciplinary: 9 (Semesters 1-3)
- b) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): 9 (Semesters 1-3)
- c) Valued Added Course (VAC): 6 (Semesters 1. 2. 4)

- d) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): 8 (Semesters 1-2, 5-6)
- e) Internship: 4 (in any Semester from 3-6)
- f) Research Methodology: 4 (in any Semester in 5 or 7)
- (III) For Honours and Honours with Research
 - a) Advanced Core, Dissertation: 40 (Semesters 7, 8)

Open Core Credits

From fourth to sixth semester, one will have time for 4 optional open core credits per semester, which one can utilise to study either of the Major or two Minors. They can also come handy, if one had changed a Minor subject in between.

Double Major

If a student is ready to do some more hard work, he/she can take some extra online courses (from designated sources only) related to the Minors and can then convert one of the Minors to a second Major by the time one completes 3/4 years of study. This is over and above the first Major. In this case, one will have a Bachelor's Degree with Double Major.

FYUGP degrees & course structures

The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme –

- (i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and
- (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline.

Curricular components

The entire FYUGP curriculum is divided into two parts- (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below.

Core courses

The core course determine the ultimate degree, diploma or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or 4th) year, 2nd Year or I Year respectively. A student needs to study at least 3 core subjects. In case of a bachelors degree in a stream the components of the core courses are major and minor or minors while bachelors degree in a discipline there are no major and minor. Usually, a student will choose one Major subject and two Minor subjects in case of degree in a stream. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. All together, irrespective of any Major or Minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 21 courses with total credit allocation of 84 over a 3-year programme.

Major Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Major Course over a 3-year period are 60 which translate to 15 courses (papers).

Minor Course

The minimum credit requirements for a Minor Course over a 3-year period are 12 which translate to 3 courses (papers).

Common courses

As the name suggests, these courses will have to be studied by all students of FYUGP. Together the common courses have a credit allocation of 36 divided over five subdivisions. They are

A brief description of these courses is given below.

(A) Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of Class XII. Each student needs to take at any three courses, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

(Key Points: A student CANNOT choose a multidisciplinary subject, if he/she has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses MUST not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen)

(B) Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is a 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two courses of 4-credits each one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are split into 2- credit parts each. The English Communication course is to be completed during the 1st and 2nd Semesters and the MIL course is to be completed during 5th and 6th Semesters.

(C) Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three Skill Courses, each with 3 credits, in Semesters 1, 2, & 3.

(D) Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credits, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 3. & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

(E) Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

Progression and exits

The progression and exits during the whole course structure is given below.

(a) After 1 Year

One can exit just after one-year. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational /Skill course (Exit Course) of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Certificate. The minimum total credit requirements are 44 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational course).

(b) After 2 Years

One can exit the programme after two-year course as well. In this case, the student will have to complete one extra Vocational/Skill course of 4 credits and can exit the programme. The student will get a Diploma. The minimum total credit requirements are 88 (and 4 credits extra for the exit Vocational course).

(c) After 3 Years

If a student completes 3 years, he/she can exit the programme. In this case the student will “get a Bachelor's Degree. The minimum total credit requirements are 120.”

(d) After 4 Years

After completion of 4 years, the student gets either a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research. The minimum total credit requirements are 160.

Admission

(A) Admission into Degree courses (SAMARTH e Gov Portal):

A Student seeking admission for the session 2025-26 should apply as per NEP-2020 on Four Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University through the SAMARTH e-Gov portal (<https://assamadmission.samarth.ac.in>). The date for submission of Application Form, and Admission are to be notified in the College Notice Board as well as in the College Website (www.hamidabadcollege.in). In addition to SAMARTH e-Gov Portal candidates must register their name in the college admission portal. Seats are reserved for students belonging to SC/ST[P]/ST(H)/OBC-MOBC categories as per State Government rules. There are also provisions of seats for students having proficiency in co-curricular activities. Original copies of certificates of proficiency in co-curricular activities and SC/ST/OBC-MOBC/BPL certificates should be uploaded/produced at the time of admission. The students selected must get themselves admitted within the stipulated time as mentioned in the website.

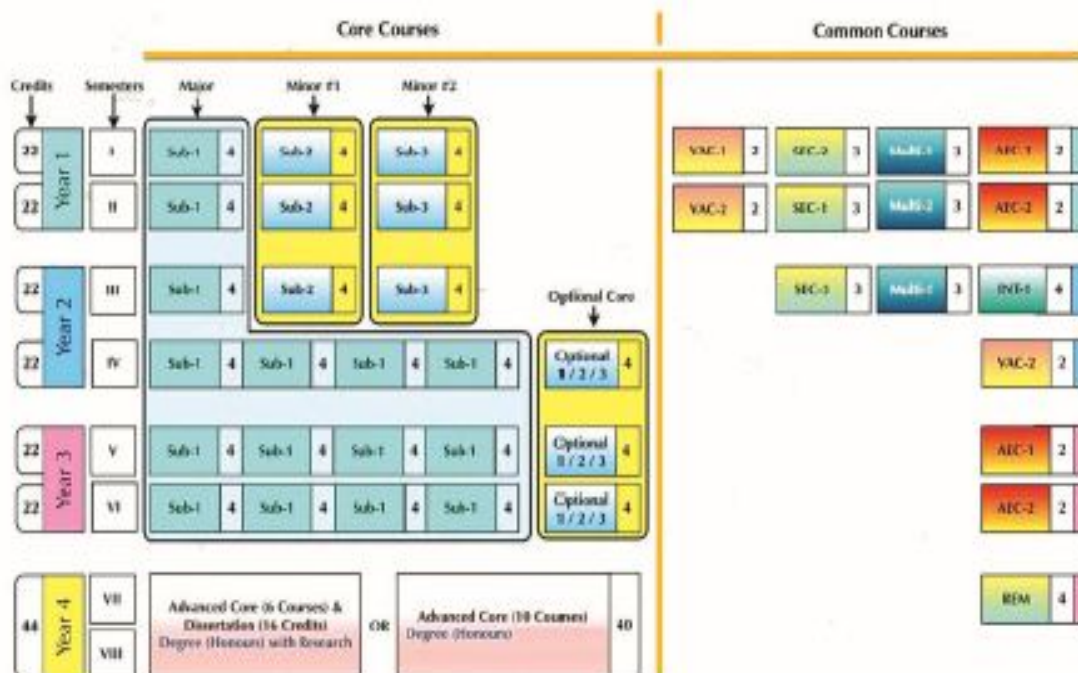


Figure 3.1: Core Courses options — Option for a Major and two Minors.

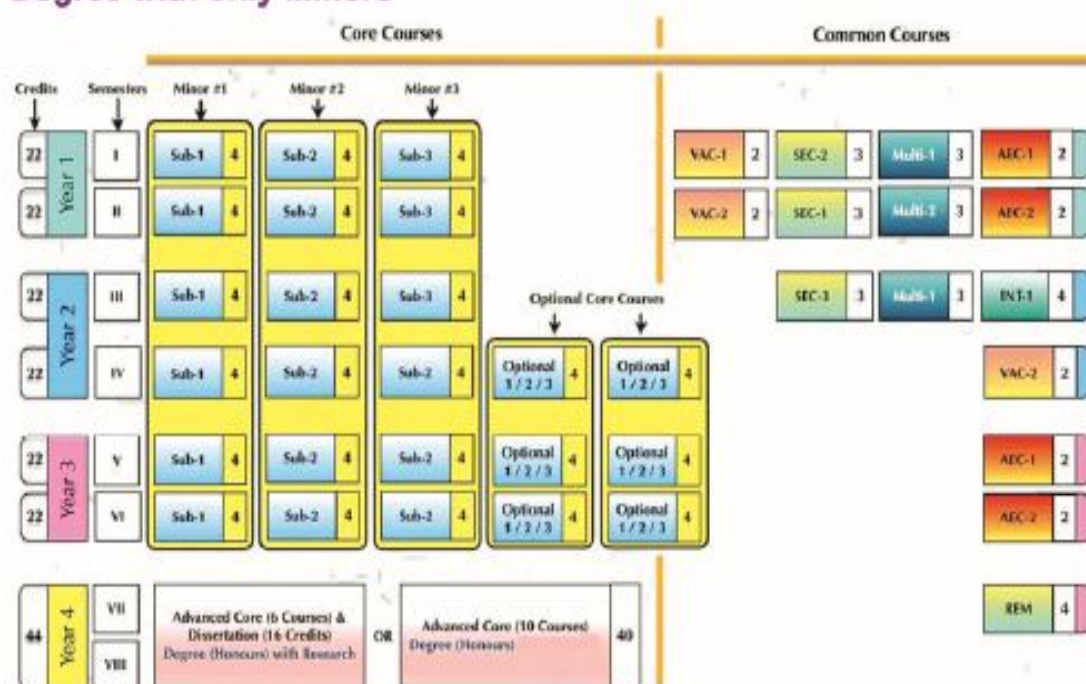

Core Course description

In this case, a student takes a Major subject with minimum 15 courses and two Minor subjects with a minimum of 3 courses each over a period of three years. Apart from these, the student also needs to take 3 Optional Minor courses during Semesters 4-6 where s/he can pick any of the two minor subjects s/he has already studied during 1st, 2nd and 3rd Semesters.

Core Course description

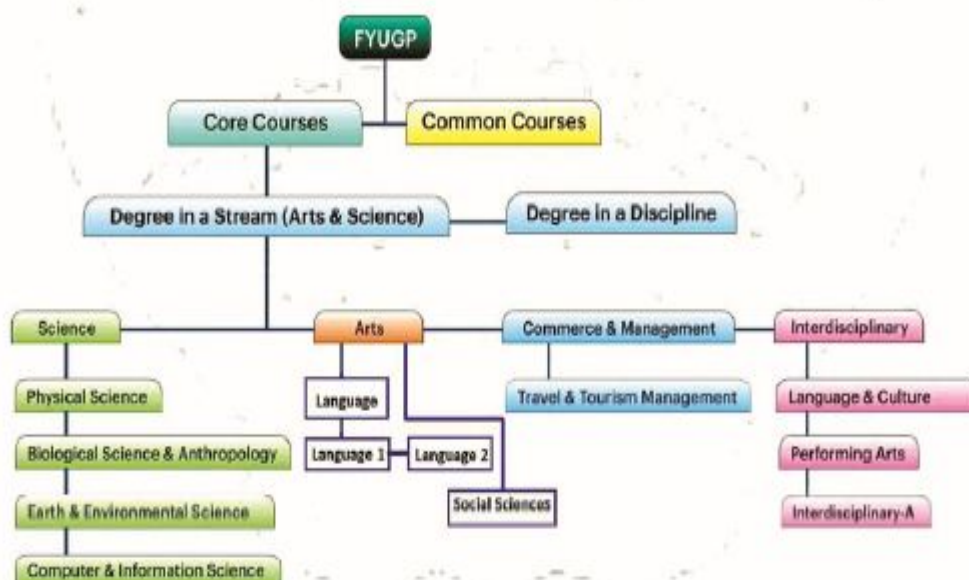
In this case, a student takes three Minor subjects each with a minimum 7 courses over a period of three years, totaling 21 courses (papers).

Subject Details – Core Subjects

In this Chapter, we describe all the existing subject details, their dependencies, and prerequisites. All the subjects are broadly divided into four streams. They are:

1. Arts
2. Science
3. Commerce & Management
4. Interdisciplinary

All these streams have their own subject groups. For example, **Physical Science** is a subject group of Science stream. Or, **Other Language** is a subject group of Arts stream. These groups with their parent streams are shown in Fig.4.1



Streams and their subject groups.

All the subject groups will have a bunch of individual subjects belonging to the respective groups, which will be described in the next section. The following applies to all these groups except the group for Commerce & Management, which will be described separately.

Subject Group — Arts

- This stream has two Subject Groups – (1) Language and (2) Social Sciences
- The maximum number of subjects which can be chosen from group is shown in the Fig.4.3.
- Altogether this stream has 17 (seventeen) subjects.

Note

The subjects shown yellow colour MAY NOT have a Major option, at present.
Please check with your college to know if a Major in these subjects are allowed.

Subject Group — Interdisciplinary

- This stream has three Subject Groups – (1) Language & Culture, (2) Performing Arts, and (3) Interdisciplinary-A (Group A).
- The maximum number of subjects which can be chosen from each group is shown in the Fig.4.3.
- Altogether this stream has 5 (five) subjects.
- None of the subjects in this stream has Major option.

Subject Group — Science

- This stream has four Groups – (1) Physical Science, (2) Biological Science & Anthropology, (3) Earth & Environmental Science, and (4) Computer & Information Science.
